LIBRARY

VISION

To be a well-equipped, technology driven and user friendly Information and Research Resource Centre.

MISSION

- To keep building extensive resources which are vital for teaching learning process.
- To provide state of the art technology for easy access and usage.

- The library contains 27,365 volumes on different subjects with 11,200 titles. There are 78 periodicals, 2062 Compact disks and 173 IEEE Online Journals. All the students, teaching and non-teaching staff are members of the library which follows open access system.

WORKING HOURS

On all working days: 8.15 a.m. to 6.45 p.m.

BOOK BORROWING ELIGIBILITY

The issue of books is regulated as follows:

- Teaching Staff : 8 Books
- Non-Teaching Staff : 3 Books
- PG Students : 8 Books
- UG Students : 6 Books

GUIDELINES TO THE USERS:

- 1. Bar-coded ID cards can be received from the Library
- ID cards are not transferable. Members are responsible for the books borrowed on their IDcards.
- ID card has to be produced at the time of borrowing books.
- 4. The books borrowed have to be returned on the last day of the University exam in each semester.

Defaulters have to pay the prescribed fine for each book.

- Based on the semester results, Toppers in each department are given one additional book each, which can be utilized till the end of university exam in that semester.
- 6. Loss of ID card should be reported immediately to the Librarian in writing.
- Signing in the Gate Register at the entrance as a token of acceptance to adhere to the rules of the library is mandatory.
- 8. Taking private belongings inside the library is prohibited.
- 9. Strict silence should be observed in the library.
- 10. No marking should be made in the library books.
- 11. Proper dress code applicable to the college should be followed.
- 12. If found guilty, owning responsibility for any damage caused to the books or other property, replacement has to be arranged promptly.
- Misbehavior in the library will lead to cancellation of membership and initiation of serious disciplinary action.

ISSUE AND RETURN OF BOOKS:

- 1. A student is entitled to keep a book for 14 days from the date of issue. For staff members the period of issue is one semester.
- 2. One renewal for a book is allowed provided there are no reservations. For renewal, members must bring the book in person.
- Reference books, Periodicals and copies of University examination question papers will not be lent.

- 4. Members on receiving books shall examine them before leaving the library and report to the librarian, if any damage is noticed.
- 5. The Librarian may recall any book at any time even if the normal period of loan has not expired.
- 6. Absence from the college will not be permitted as an excuse for delay in returning the books.

OVERDUE CHARGES:

- For default of return of books on the due date, a fine of Rs.1/- per day and Rs.2/- from third week onwards will be levied.
- 2. If a book is not returned within 28 days from the date of issue, students will not be allowed to attend the class.

LOSS OF BOOKS:

 Loss of books should be reported to the librarian immediately in writing and the member should either replace it with another good copy or pay twice the cost of the book in addition to overdue charges.

BOOKS RESERVATION:

1. Members can reserve books and check periodically for their availability.

SUGGESTION:

Members may suggest in writing to the librarian about the purchase of any textbooks or reference books, which may or may not be available in the library or for which the number of copies may not be sufficient.

GUIDELINES TO STUDENTS

The rules and regulations of the college may undergo changes at any time depending on the need and the emerging situation. Students and parents are expected to update themselves with the latest rules and regulations. Every student is expected to follow the rules and regulations of the college and maintain strict discipline. Right from the very inception, VCET maintains a high standard of discipline. Students should learn to admire the intention of the college as the rules and regulations are for the benefit of students and their Parents / Guardians. A number of awards is being instituted in the name of living legends to recognize and encourage the committed achievers and rank holders among students.

(A) ON-LINE CLASSES

DOs

While attending online classes the students shall

- Log in and arrive to the virtual class on time, preferably several minutes before the scheduled start time.
- 2. Wear appropriate clothes attire that normally is worn inside of the classroom.
- 3. Greet the course Incharge during entry and exit of the class sessions.
- 4. Be in their seat with all materials gathered when the course Incharge starts the class virtually.
- 5. Read the syllabus beforehand so that they can be prepared for the discussion.
- Create an optimal study/work space. They can clear space for computer/laptop, notebooks and whatever other tools they need.
- 7. Establish their working space with the most reliable internet connection.
- 8. Ensure to have good lighting background to make their face clearly seen and also have their

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background free from movement and noises of their family members.

- 9. Test their technology before the start of the class to ensure that they all function properly, including monitor, headphones, and microphone.
- 10. Charge their gadgets fully before class to have uninterrupted class sessions.
- 11. Use the restroom before class to avoid getting up multiple times throughout.
- 12. Study hard and go through study materials several times before the exam. They shall attend all tests with utmost genuineness and professionalism.
- Politely inform the other residents about their schedule so that the inmates respect their privacy as much as possible.
- 14. Stay muted during lectures while other students are asking questions.
- 15. Be interactive as much as possible. They shall ask questions, offer answers to class questions when prompted and take notes.
- 16. Use the chat feature responsibly. They can use this space to ask for help, provide a quick answer or give feedback to a peer's point.

DON'Ts

While attending online classes the students shall not

- 1. Involve in other online activities that may distract them during classes.
- Sit around distractions. Study spaces shall be away from tempting diversions like TV, game console or a family pet.
- 3. Post links and memes in the chat. The classroom chat shall not be the place to socialize with peers.
- 4. Blame late or missed assignments on technical

issues. Experiencing technical difficulties shall be let known to the course Incharge in advance.

5. Give up in case of any technical difficulty during a class, whether it be lost Internet connection or accidentally logging out of a meeting. They shall make every effort to resume attendance and participation in the class before informing the course Incharge of the problem.

(B) CLASS ROOM MANNERS

Students are strictly expected

- 1. To be polite, dignified, neat and obedient everywhere in the campus.
- 2. Not to enter the campus in inebriated condition, failing which they will be removed from college.
- 3. To be seated in the lecture hall five minutes before the commencement of the class.
- 4. To stand up as a mark of respect when a faculty enters or leaves the class room.
- To maintain discipline and silence inside the lecture halls/drawing halls / labs / workshops/ seminar halls/ meeting halls / college buses.
- 6. Not to loiter outside the classroom during the lecture hours.
- 7. To bring their own calculators, drawing instruments, charts, data book etc., whenever needed.
- 8. To take care of their belongings and not to bring any valuable items to the college.
- 9. To bring and use laptops only for academic purposes.
- To avoid chewing bubble gum, chocolate and any edible item inside the class room.
- To wear their own lab coats and bring observation notebooks to the labs/classes regularly.

- To submit the record of experiments done in a practical class in the next lab class itself.
- To avoid being irregular in lab work, thus be not allowed for the next experiment and be marked absent for the lab class.
- 14. Not to leave the lab until the given experiment is done and the lab class is over.
- 15. To be very attentive while doing their lab experiments in the lab classes.
- 16. Sporting tattoo is strictly prohibited.
- 17. Refrain from ordering foods online.

(C) MENTORSHIP

The college has a mentor-mentee system under which every student is assigned a mentor in the first year, who will act as a guide and academic advisor for the academic and overall progress of the student during the tenure in the college.

(D) LEAVE LETTER, PERMISSION & ABSENTEEISM

Attendance will be taken at the beginning of every period by the respective staff handling the class. Any student who comes late to class or who is unavailable while taking the attendance will be considered absent for that session.

- Students who come late or absent themselves for any period in the forenoon / afternoon will be treated absent for half a day.
- Students can avail leave only after getting prior permission except for sudden sickness or unforeseen circumstances.
- In the case of unforeseen reasons or sickness, a leave letter signed by the parent has to be sent by courier, post or through a messenger to the mentor.

- 4. Students who require one day leave should submit a leave letter signed by the parent and obtain permission from the mentor and the class in charge at least a day prior to taking leave.
- 5. Students who require two or more than two days leave should submit a leave letter signed by the parent to the mentor and get the approval of the mentor, class in charge and the HoD, at least the day before availing leave.
- 6. For unforeseen/ sick leave for one day or more, a leave letter signed by the parent has to be sent to the mentor through post/ courier on the first day of leave and for sick leave more than two days a medical certificate recommending the duration of leave, signed by a registered medical practitioner should be sent along with the leave letter. A fitness certificate signed by the same medical practitioner should be submitted on the day of reporting back to classes. It is desirous that a parent accompanies the student on the day of reporting back to classes.
- 7. Phone messages/ fax messages requesting leave for a student will not be accepted.
- 8. If a student is absent for 3 cumulative working days continuously or at random in that semester without prior permission, his/her parents will have to meet the HoD. Only then he/she will be permitted to attend the classes. When the 3 cumulative working days extends to 5 cumulative working days his/her name will be struck off from the roll and re-admission fee of Rs.500/- has to be paid, if this continues more than three times the matter will be dealt with seriously.
- 9. Leave not sanctioned will be treated as absent.
- Students who fail to report on the re-opening day after long holidays (more than 3 holidays)

should leave a message through any source or representations by Parent or Guardian will not be accepted.

- 11. Leave letters must be submitted to the concerned mentor only.
- 12. Students are permitted to avail On Duty leave as per the requirement, but only with the prior permission from HoD/Principal.
- 13. Taking leave on days adjoining / bridging declared holidays is not permitted.

(E) DRESS CODE

Students are instructed:

- To wear their identity cards as soon as they enter the campus and continue to do so until they leave the campus and also during travel by the college bus with respect to those who avail the college transport facility.
- 2. To wear the identity card continuously displayed and not hidden, inside their shirt pockets.
- Not to wear identity/transport ID card belonging to others and not to indulge in any malpractice that will be invite severe action.
- Not to be in situation of being spot fined Rs.25/by the discipline committee for not wearing the ID card.
- To get a new ID card within a week of losing the original ID card, from the college office and in the mean time to wear the temporary ID card issued by the librarian.
- 6. To wear clean appropriate clothes.
- 7. To wear formal pants with formal shirts tucked in properly in the case of boys/Churidhars with neatly pinned dhuppatas in case of girls, as long as they are in the college campus.

- 8. Not to wear T-Shirts and other casuals.
- 9. Not to wear fancy / wide belts but simple formal belts with small buckles.
- Not to sport a beard/French beards and long hair but come neatly shaved with neat hair cut in case of boys.
- 11. Not to wear short tops/leggings/tight pants, thin flimsy dresses in case of girls.
- Not to wear flashy dresses/fancy jewels or leave the hair loose but come with neatly plaited (braided) hair in case of girls.
- 13. To wear black polished leather shoes with black socks on all days in the case of boys and on lab days in the case of girls for safety reasons. On other days girls may wear black leather cut shoes with black socks.
- 14. To adhere to the dress code throughout the day till they leave the college.
- 15. To wear lab coats for all lab sessions.
- Not to deviate from the dress code during any programs conducted by the college/ department.
- 17. To wear blazers for all college functions and whenever required.
- 18. Not to plan and wear group/ friends'/class dress etc., during the tenure of the college.
- To adhere to the college dress code whenever the student comes to the college – ICP classes, for getting 'No DUES' signed, model exams, university exams or any such occasion.
- 20. Not to put themselves in situations that will warrant being sent home or calling the parents/ guardians by the discipline committee, for not adhering to any of the above.

(F) GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Plan to attend family / religious functions during weekends or holidays.
- 2. Be courteous and greet staff members when meeting them in the campus.
- 3. Meet the Principal/ HoD/ Staff only during the break time.
- Attend all functions, meeting, and take part in extra-curricular activities conducted by the college.
- 5. Conduct yourself, wherever you are, in such a way to bring repute to the college.
- Totally avoid smoking/chewing bubble gum/ consuming alcohol/tobacco products inside the campus.
- Do not indulge in any kind of celebrations without prior permission from the management and breach of this prohibition would be viewed seriously by the authorities.
- Do not litter the class room or the college campus and keep the class room and the college environment clean.
- 9. Switch off fans and lights when not in use
- Bring to the notice of Parents / Guardians the periodical reports which would be sent regularly and be regular in bringing Parents / Guardians to the HoD/Principal for any discussion regarding the same.
- 11. Refrain from exchange of cards/ mail/ conversations with the opposite gender.
- Maintain proper discipline while travelling in the college bus – boys should occupy the back rows and girls, the front rows.
- 13. Wear transport ID card while travelling in the college bus.
- 14. Do not drive two wheelers or four wheelers without obtaining proper driving licence.

15. Refrain from driving triples in two wheelers.

(G) RAGGING – AN OFFENCE

Ragging in any form, at any place or time is a cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including getting summarily expulsed from the college / institution / university.

Extract of Tamil Nadu Govt. Gazette- Extra ordinary Dt. 29-1-97 (Bill No. 8 of 1997 TamilNadu Prohibition of Ragging Act):

- In this act, unless the context otherwise requires, "Ragging" means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes.
- Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such student; or
- Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform.
- 2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
- 3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates, abets or propagates "Ragging" within or outside any educational institution shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- 4. Any student convicted of an offence under section 4, shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

5. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the head of an educational institution to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, such head of the educational institution person responsible for the management of the educational institution shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true, shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

(H) GENDER CELL

A gender cell has been constituted to facilitate a gender-sensitive and congenial campus environment at VCET so that anyone in the campus is not subjected to gender specific discrimination. For any information /complaints the cell members may be contacted through gencel@vcet.ac.in

(I) GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The Grievance REDRESSAL cell of the college functions with the objective of resolving the grievances of students, faculty and other employees of the college and parents. Complaints/grievances may be dropped into the suggestion box or sent to gdc@vcet.ac.in

SUGGESTION BOX

Every week the suggestion box is opened and necessary action is initiated.

(J) EXAMINATION RULES

 Students are expected to be thorough with the University exam rules and regulations and follow them strictly. Information regarding the same is available in Anna University, Chennai website.

- 2. There will be a series of three internal assessment tests and a model exam in a semester.
- 3. The duration of each internal assessment test will be 90 minutes and for model exam 3 hours.
- 4. Students are expected to attend the internal tests and model exam compulsorily.
- 5. Absenteeism for the internal test/model exam is not permitted and is dealt with seriously.
- 6. Failure in more than two subjects in any test will be considered as a severe lapse in academic performance. The Parents / Guardian of these students will be summoned to explain about the poor performance and a written commitment will be obtained from them for improved performance in the ensuring tests and Examination.
- Students involving in malpractices during internal tests/ model examination will be punished by providing "0" marks for all the subjects in the internal tests/ model exam and for internal marks calculation.
- 8. Students must be in their allotted seats 10 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
- Students indulging in malpractice will be sent out from the examination hall and disciplinary action will be initiated against them and they will be marked absent for the examination.
- 10. Students are allowed to use only Anna University approved programmable calculators.
- 11. Students are not allowed to borrow calculator, instruments or any other stationery in the examination hall.
- 12. Students are expected not to write anything on the question paper.
- 13. Students will not be allowed to leave the hall before the completion of the examination time.

(k) Road Safety and General Guidelines & Practices

Velammal College of Engineering and Technology, Madurai, initiates and implements stringent measures to root out the menace of road accidents to our college students and strive to make our budding Engineers as responsible road users. A Periodical Review Meeting is conducted to assess the current situation and the committee recommends the following guidelines and practices to our students.

- 1. Students are restricted to go home during college working hours
- 2. In case of emergency students, with proper information from parents, can go out with the out pass approved by HoD/Dean/Principal
- Mode of Transport of the students would be collected by the departments and the change in the mode of transport has to be brought to the notice of the department.
- Students coming by two wheeler or four wheeler should have valid driving licenses, RCs, and Insurance Certificates etc

- Two wheeler riders and the pillion rider must wear helmets and advised to follow road rules always.
- 6. Riding bike in triples is restricted on campus.
- 7. Students are advised not to use bikes with more than 125 cc. engine capacity
- 8. Two wheelers without silencers are banned on campus.
- 9. Lending Bikes/Cars to other students is to be avoided.
- 10. Students must follow all the rules strictly and the repeated the violation of traffic rules, if any, is viewed seriously and may invite suitable punishments including suspension from the college.
- 11. Outsiders meeting students on campus should strictly be avoided.
- 12. Over speed and rash driving should be strictly avoided.
- 13. Day scholars are not allowed to take food in mess at any cost.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT EVALUATION OF STUDENTS' PERFORMANCE

Anna University Stream:

The academic performance of a student, who have admitted in 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 for each course in UG and PG programme is assessed by Anna University, Chennai by conducting written examination, projects and viva voce in two parts namely internal assessment and external assessment. In this, the internal assessment is done by the college and the external assessment is done by the University by conducting the end semester examination.

Autonomous Stream:

The academic performance of the students, who have admitted in 2021-2022 onwards, in each course in a programme (UG & PG) is assessed by the college by conducting written exam, projects and viva voce in two parts namely internal assessment and End semester examination awarding 100 marks in total. In this for theory course, the internal assessment of 40 marks will be awarded based on the performance of internal assessment tests and 60 marks will be awarded based on the performance of end semester examination conducted by the college.

INTERNAL MARKS – MODE OF ASSESSMENT

Internal assessment plays a crucial role in the process of evaluating the performance of students. It facilitates the students:

- i. To acquire in-depth knowledge in the subject;
- To score higher marks and distinctions in the university examination;-So, losing even a single mark will enable the students either losing the exam or distinction;

- Easy coverage of syllabus at the time of final examination;
- iv. Providing leverage and competitive advantage to the students

Anna University Stream

It is informed that even though the Internal assessment tests and Model exam are conducted and corrected by the faculty of concerned college, the Internal Assessment of Marks for each subject (20% weightage) will be calculated by Anna University only based on the performance in Internal assessment tests and Model Exam conducted by the College. Skipping a test, in this regard, will render the students helpless without a chance for retest. Hence, students are requested to concentrate on cycle tests and model examination right from the beginning of each semester.

In this connection, each college has to upload the details pertaining to attendance of the students in four phases and the details of test marks in three phases in each semester in the University Website, which will be opened at specified timings. It is up to the University to assess the marks for Internal Assessment. However, the students can verify their attendance and mark details periodically in their University Homepage. Discrepancy, if any, has to be brought to the notice of the examination cell of the college and class in charge of the department immediately for remedial action by the University.

Autonomous Stream:

The internal mark for 40 will be awarded based on the performance of Internal Assessment tests as per the procedure given in the college Regulations 2021 (R-2021) for UG & PG programmes.

(I) TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE WRITING OF EXAMINATIONS

- 1. A neat handwriting gives a good impression.
- 2. The first answer written in the answer paper should be written in the best possible manner.
- 3. Sub-titles give a blue print of the answer.
- 4. Answer all the required number of questions. Do not omit any questions.
- 5. Drawing Charts and figures help score high marks.
- 6. Figures drawn should have titles.
- 7. Avoid long paragraphs. Short paragraphs with suitable sub-titles will fetch more marks.
- Try to write answers in correct sequences.
 (i.e.) Answer the questions in the increasing sequence.
- Write the question numbers and sub-division numbers correctly as given in the question paper.
- 10. Leave some space between two answers.
- 11. Number of lines written on a page and the size of letters should be normal.
- 12. Short and simple sentences will minimize the probability of mistakes.
- 13. Write the Register Number and Course Code correctly in the space allotted.
- 14. Mention the total number of pages written.
- 15. Avoid writing anything offensive or funny, which is outside the scope of your answer that may lead to disciplinary action against the student.

Revision of answers at the end is necessary. (M) RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR HOSTEL RESIDENTS

Students who wish to stay in the hostel should apply in the prescribed application form.

THE FOLLOWING HOSTEL RULES SHOULD BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO:

- 1. Students should occupy only the room allotted by the Warden/Deputy warden.
- 2. Students are responsible for cleanliness of their rooms.
- Students are expected to come only in formal dress to college. Hostel students have to strictly follow the dress code while coming to campus outside the regular class hours.
- Students are advised to take care of their valuables kept in the rooms. The college authorities will not be responsible for any loss of cash / valuables.
- 5. Students are instructed not to keep jewelry or any other expensive item inside the hostel room.
- 6. Students are not permitted to stay in the hostel during college working hours without specific permission from the Warden or Deputy Warden.
- 7. Only parents and close relatives authorized by the parents will be allowed to meet the inmates of the hostel.
- Parents are requested to give a list of authorized visitors / local guardians with photographs who alone will be permitted to visit the students in the hostel and to do other formalities in the absence of parents.
- 9. Students can entertain the visitors on holidays from 10.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.

- 10. Guests / Visitors / Local Guardians are not permitted to enter / stay in the hostels.
- 11. Day Scholars are not allowed to visit the hostels on any account.
- 12. Students will be permitted to go home only with the consent of parents.
- 13. Students who have to go home during working days due to sickness, unforeseen circumstances, functions or ceremony must get the prior permission from the Principal or Warden with the requisition from Parents in person or through letter. The presence of local guardian is necessary in the absence of the Parents.
- Inmates going out should report to the hostel authorities by 6.30 p.m. after regular classes, failing which they will be fined.
- 15. No refund will be paid to the hostel students if they leave in the middle of the year.
- 16. Students willing to attend the computer classes in the evening outside the college Campus must get a letter from their parents stating that the college is not responsible for their ward's behavior and for whatever happens to them

during that period. On such days, they have to make their own arrangement for their dinner, as the mess closes at 7.45 p.m.

- 17. For the purpose of Laundry, only dhobis authorized by the college should be utilized.
- 18. Students should avoid wasting food, water and electric power.
- 19. Students taking unauthorized electrical connections will be severely punished.
- 20. Unauthorized electrical fittings and gadgets should not be used in the hostel rooms.
- 21. Students should refrain from antisocial and undesirable activities such as consumption of alcohol, tobacco, gambling, ragging etc.,
- 22. Students should not enter the hostel during college working hours nor allow their day Scholar friends inside their rooms. Students are instructed to adhere to the study timings, mess timings and telephone timings.
- 23. Attendance will be taken during study hours. Any student found absent will be dealt with seriously and parents will be called for if necessary.

STUDY TIMINGS:

- Students should maintain absolute silence and they are instructed to be inside their respective rooms during the study hours, 8.00 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- Students are advised to utilize the morning hours for study.

HOSTEL MESS:

Hostel mess is run by the management with guidance of Warden/Deputy warden and student representative. Mess charges are collected on annual basis at the time of admission of the year.

- Develop a passion for English.
- While conversing in English with someone, give importance to the message and do not be preoccupied with the grammatical accuracy. Fluency over accuracy is accepted at the initial stage. On becoming fluent, one should try to improve grammar in communication.
- Accept yourself as you are. Do not compare yourself with others.

- Practice and exposure are very important.
- Whenever you get an opportunity to speak in front of others, make use of it. Face the audience boldly.
- Think in English. If you think in your mother tongue and speak in English, it may not sound natural. Though it is difficult, it's not impossible.

(Q) EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS FOR STUDENTS

- One of the educationalists pointed out that most of the graduates from Professional courses do not suffer from the problem of unemployment, but from that of unemployability. The trust has taken a serious note of this and is doing its best to see that the graduates are free from this blemish. 







